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- 2 Section 2201. Effective date.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 PART I

- 7 Section 101. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
- 9 Appropriation Act of 2018.
