

AN ACT

1 Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure
2 Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts
3 within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by
4 the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in
5 support of the professional licensure boards assigned
6 thereto.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. (a) The sum of \$72,812,000, or as much thereof
10 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
11 Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General
12 Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau
13 of Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year
14 July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

15 (b) The appropriation under subsection (a) includes
16 \$10,000,000 for information technology and other associated
17 costs related to the replacement of the PA Licensure System. The
18 \$10,000,000 may not be expended for any other purpose. The
19 Department of State shall issue a report on November 15, 2024,

1 and on May 15, 2025, to the chairperson and minority chairperson
2 of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate, the chairperson
3 and minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the
4 House of Representatives, the chairperson and minority
5 chairperson of the Consumer Protection and Professional
6 Licensure Committee of the Senate and the chairperson and
7 minority chairperson of the Professional Licensure Committee of
8 the House of Representatives that contains all of the following:

9 (1) An accounting of funds expended by the Bureau of
10 Professional and Occupational Affairs related to the
11 replacement of the PA Licensure System by category of
12 expenditure.

13 (2) A status update on the implementation and timeline
14 of the replacement project, including a description of
15 efforts to improve or upgrade Bureau of Professional and
16 Occupational Affairs technology infrastructure, to interface
17 with educational institutions in this Commonwealth, to
18 facilitate and expedite education verification, to fully
19 implement licensure compacts enacted in statute and improve
20 the timely issuance of professional licenses.

21 (3) Any other information deemed necessary or
22 appropriate by the department.

23 Section 2. (a) The sum of \$11,025,000, or as much thereof
24 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted
25 receipts account of the State Board of Medicine for the
26 operation of the board for the fiscal year July 1, 2024, to June
27 30, 2025.

28 (b) The sum of \$3,204,000, or as much thereof as may be
29 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts
30 account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine for the

1 operation of the board for the fiscal year July 1, 2024, to June
2 30, 2025.

3 (c) The sum of \$454,000, or as much thereof as may be
4 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts
5 account of the State Board of Podiatry for the operation of the
6 board for the fiscal year July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

7 (d) The sum of \$946,000, or as much thereof as may be
8 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Athletic Commission
9 Augmentation Account for the State Athletic Commission, as
10 authorized by 5 Pa.C.S. § 1512 (relating to Athletic Commission
11 Augmentation Account), for the support and operation of the
12 commission for the fiscal year July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

13 (e) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b), (c)
14 and (d) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the
15 Department of State, a general government appropriation or any
16 other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as
17 separate appropriations respectively.

18 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024, or
19 immediately, whichever is later.
