SUMMARY: This bill would amend Title 75 (Vehicles) creating two special registration plates to be displayed on passenger cars and trucks.

ANALYSIS: House Bill 215 would create an Honoring Our Women Veterans special registration plate, which would designate a vehicle as belonging to a person who is honoring women veterans of the armed forces of the United States. The Department of Transportation (DOT) would issue an Honoring Women Veterans special registration plate to individuals upon application and a fee of \$35, which would be in addition to the annual registration fee. The special registration plate may only be used on a passenger car or truck with a registered gross weight of no more than 14,000 pounds. The Veteran's Trust Fund would receive \$15 of the fee paid by the applicant for the plate. The portion of the fee transferred to the Veteran's Trust Fund under this act would be used for programs and resources that assist women veterans. Additionally, DOT would be permitted to issue a special registration plate for recipients of the Legion of Merit upon application and a fee of \$20. The fee would be in addition to the annual registration fee and the special registration plate may only be used on a passenger car or truck with a registered gross weight of not more than 14,000 pounds.

This act would be effective 120 days upon passage.

FISCAL IMPACT: DOT would incur a one-time cost of \$15,500 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-18 for system changes and the creation of the two specialized designs for the two registration plates defined under this act. This bill would also generate revenue to the Veteran's Trust Fund.
