SUMMARY: This bill provides for temporary services to aging-out individuals through county agencies.

ANALYSIS: HB 2552 establishes an aging-out individual may elect to receive housing, case management and other support services through a county agency through December 31, 2020.

County agencies shall provide a notice of these temporary services to aging-out individuals and provide all appropriate support services if the individual elects to receive service. The agency shall also develop a transition plan prior to the termination of temporary services and provide a list of all individuals eligible for temporary services.

The Department of Human Services (DHS) shall, from funds appropriated or otherwise made available to the department for the purpose, award grants to county agencies for temporary services and publicize the availability of services. Within seven days of the effective date, DHS shall submit a budget request including an estimate of the amount of money needed and the source of funding, including any available federal funds.

Any grant received by a county agency shall not affect future need-based grants and budget processes.

The act shall expire December 31, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT: The total cost for services to aging-out individuals retroactive to March 1, 2020 and effective through December 31, 2020 is \$9.130 million, including \$3.652 million in FY 2019-20 and \$5.478 million in FY 2020-21.

While DHS is required to submit a budget request in the amount necessary for these services, awarding grants to counties and publicizing the availability of these services is contingent on funds being appropriated or otherwise made available to the department for that purpose.
