**SUMMARY:** Senate Bill 1110 amends the Disease Prevention and Control Law of 1955 for the purpose of requiring the Department of Health (DOH) to provide communicable disease information by municipality. The bill also permits DOH to provide reports and records when necessary.

**ANALYSIS:** This legislation, under a proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the governor that is based upon a communicable disease, the secretary or local health authority is required to release explicit information within a specific timeframe. Such information includes age, gender, race, area of residency, connections to a health care facility, school, or place of employment. This identifiable information must be listed on publicly accessible websites of either DOH or of local boards or departments of health. Further, DOH is required to provide this health-related information to 911 centers, law enforcement officers, and fire and EMS departments within 24 hours of receiving confirmed communicable disease information.

SB1110 shall take effect immediately upon enactment.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** According to the Department of Health, SB1110 will cost approximately \$258,000 to carry out provisions of this bill as it relates to personnel. Additional costs may be incurred for information technology upgrades.
